

Mary L. Gray is a Senior Researcher at Microsoft Research and Associate Professor of the Media School, with affiliations in American Studies, Anthropology, and Gender Studies at Indiana University. She also holds an Adjunct faculty position at the Indraprastha Institute of Information Technology in Delhi, India. She studied Anthropology before receiving her Ph.D. in Communication from the University of California, San Diego in 2004. Her research looks at how media access and everyday uses of technologies transform people's lives. Her last book, *Out in the Country: Youth, Media, and Queer Visibility in Rural America* (New York University Press, 2009), which won awards from scholarly societies in anthropology, media studies, and sociology, looked at how young people in the rural United States use media to negotiate their sexual and gender identities, local belonging, and connections to broader, imagined communities. Mary's current book project, co-authored with computer scientist Siddharth Suri, examines digital workforces and the future of employment through case studies of present day crowdwork on four different crowdsourcing platforms, comparing workers' experiences in the United States and India.
